The natural world is not merely the result of random, unguided processes, but is the masterpiece of God. The Bible tells us that every created thing reveals the glory of God. It is a sort of language by which God communicates with people that he exists and that he is glorious. We ought to be moved to worship, seeing God's goodness, grace, power and creativity in the things around us. Nothing is ordinary in God's world. The next time you take a walk in the forest and smell the dead leaves, sink your teeth into a delectable cheeseburger, stare out the window at the sparkling snow, play with your dog, or listen to the gentle chirping of crickets in a summer night – stand in awesome wonder and let your soul sing, "How great thou art!". We have made it to Western Australia after 15 days on the road.

We have seen some lovely scenery, no wildlife much and so far only some wildflower's The weather has been great although it is a little windy which is cool.

We have just spent 2 days at Karalundi Aboriginal Boarding school (58 kilometres north of Meekatharra.) It is run by the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

Karalundi is an Aboriginal word meaning 'clear, good water'.

Karalundi has 40 boarders, 20 girls and 20 boys from Year 7- Year 10.

They teach them life skills on the farm. There is a vegetable garden, horses that they learn to ride and look after. They also work part time in the café to learn the value of money and how to wait on table and serve customers etc. It was a lovely experience and they run a caravan park and all funds raised are returned into the school.

It was lovely to stay and support the school.

We have now progressed further north to Newman, where Liz was a remote nurse some 15 years ago. We enjoyed seeing how the town had changed since they were out there.

We are now moving over to the coast and hoping to see more wildflowers.

A special thank you to Sandra for taking on the extra duties while we are away, I will give you a break from flowers etc when I return.
