As part of God's people we are called by God, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to share the love and grace of Jesus Christ, within our community through regular worship, faithful witness and humble service.

Minister's Message:

I have been reading Genesis and the story of Abraham and his descendants. It struck me yesterday that Joseph the dreamer actually set in place the societal structures that in a short time became the means of putting his people into the anguish of slavery. He built infrastructure that meant massive quantities of grain could be stored against the threatened famine. He then sold back to the people their own grain so that they would survive the famine. Buildings showed the competency of pharaoh's government and the grain generated income. This enabled future building that trumpeted the divinity of the pharaoh at the expense of the people. And in time enslavement for the vulnerable. What started out as a response to need became a tool of oppression from which the Hebrew people needed to be rescued.

Often, things that we do start out for very good reasons but over time the reasons change. And the outcomes also change.

The good news of the Kingdom of God that Jesus taught brought life and transformation to many. But it really did not take long for the message to change. As the church became more respectable much that was vibrant was covered over by ritual and behaviour. When Constantine decided that Christianity was the state religion, so much more was lost. Freedom to follow the Spirit was squashed under the weight of structures and creeds that allowed the 'church' to become a tool of government. The 'church' became central to the community not because of its message, although it was often trumpeted, but as a means of social control and of the ambition of its leaders. Money, buildings, serfs and status were more important to the system than good news. Things had to change. There were many over the centuries who called the church back to its true identity, but privilege is addictive.

Most of us have grown up on the tail end of 'Christendom', that time in history where the church was at the centre of society and expected privilege and recognition for its role as an order-er of society. But things have now changed. That is not where we find ourselves. Public scandals have brought ill repute, deservedly so. My generation began a period of questioning that has seen many walk away from the church because it/we have not offered what was promised.

This Lent, are we willing together to really look at ourselves and consider what we need to let go of and what we need to modify and where we need to adventure into new being? It is hard work. Are we willing to name burdens that we place, often unwittingly, on others? And remove them. Are we prepared to consider what burdens we carry as a community of faith that limit our ability to be bearers of good news?

God is present. God is love. We are called to be people who announce this with our lives and our words. Let's do it!

AGENDA ITEM

A proposal has been received from Church Council that the time of worship be 10am on Sundays. This recommendation will be put to the Congregation at the meeting.

World Day of Prayer:

This year the World Day of Prayer will be held at the Lovat Chapel in Meehan Street – opposite the Catholic Church – at 10 am. Men and women are invited to attend. This ecumenical service has been held in Yass for many years and it is a great gathering of folk from all the churches.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE:

Property Committee met in late January. A quote for painting the gutters and fascia on the St Andrew's building was accepted and this work was carried out in January. A grant towards the cost of this work was received from Yass Valley Council and the Property Committee has been saving for several years to have enough funds for the balance.

A working bee is planned to look at safety issues which need attention around St Andrew's Church building and the hall.

Church Council has given permission to accept a quote from Capital Asphalt for repairs and resealing the driveway at 2 Cliff Street. We are not sure yet when this work will be done. The funds for this work are in the Sale Proceeds Account and have been approved by Presbytery and Synod.

We held a working bee to spray the weeds at the edges of the existing sealed area. Tree bark and rubbish was removed.

New volunteers to join Property Committee are always welcome. (Ruth Thompson for members of Yass Parish Property Committee)
